There was a lot of response. The following is a breakdown:

The public doesn't understand how the politicians can mandate a fee that goes to a private group.

The public would like to know who voted to allow this to happen.

More than half of the people who have responded do not have a problem with what LCHIP's tries to accomplish except how they receive their money.

A majority were unaware how the funds leave the state and go to LCHIP's

There is a fee to record at the registry of deeds. Now there is an added fee up to \$100 that goes to LCHIP's. (Most all were very upset)

The public feels they have a right to donate to who they choose but do not want the politicians to make a law to tell them who they have to donate to.

The politicians that sponsored the bill (the Registry of Deeds) and the ones that voted for it, if they would like to donate their money to LCHIPS that's fine but the economy needs the millions of dollars to be applied to the general fund so you don't have to increase fees and taxes, lay state employees off, go after state retirement and more.

Where Article 6-a of our constitution instructs that "All revenue" accruing to the state from registrations of motor vehicles shall be used for public highways and that no part of such revenues shall be diverted to any other purpose whatsoever.

If the public wants to donate for a moose plate they have to send a separate check because article 6 is very clear no part of such revenues shall be diverted to any other purpose whatsoever, therefore all monies that have been sent in declared as donations has to be sent back to the state.
